

### August - October Update

Identification and Development of Toolkits

Over the last few months we have been hard at work developing actions for Penobscot Climate Action Toolkits.

The 10 toolkits will be made up of high priority and high impact actions recommended to address regional vulnerability areas and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. While more than 30 strategies will ultimately be recommended for consideration, the toolkits will give specific implementation resources to 10 strategies to kick-start action.

These toolkits were developed in cooperation with our project Advisory Committee and Working Groups. The Advisory Committee is responsible for overall project alignment with local needs and priorities. The Working Groups are responsible for informing toolkit details within one of five topic areas, including: housing, transportation, environment and quality of life, local economies and livelihoods, and health.

Take the 13 recommendations from the 2nd working group meeting and further narrow that list to the final 10 toolkits.
